Conclusions



→ Digital services must be open, flexible, and cocreated

→ Active user engagement drives visibility and trust

Common digital infrastructures not only boost research capacity but also make regions more attractive for talent and investment, supporting vibrant business communities.


→ Shared infrastructures strengthen excellence and attractiveness


